Chapter 74 TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES**

**ARTICLE V. BICYCLES**

**Sec. 74-166. Riding on sidewalks.**

(a) No person shall ride a bicycle upon any sidewalk within a business district or in a school zone, or on any other sidewalk or highway, when official traffic devices or signs are posted prohibiting the riding of bicycles thereon. When any person is riding a bicycle upon a sidewalk, such person shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrians, and if necessary, the person riding such bicycle shall dismount and vacate the sidewalk in order to prevent a collision, and any person riding a bicycle upon the sidewalk must have the bicycle under control at all times.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person riding a bicycle on the sidewalk to attempt to pass another rider or person going in the same direction on such sidewalk without giving an alarm by audible signals a reasonable distance before overtaking, and/or passing such pedestrian, and until it becomes evident that the person so warned is aware of the approach of such person riding said bicycle.

**Sec. 74-167. License required.**

No person shall ride or propel a bicycle upon any street, sidewalk or alley unless such bicycle is registered and tagged as provided herein, except that no license shall be required for a bicycle, the wheels of which are less than 20 inches in diameter.

**Sec. 74-168. Registration.**

(a) Required; application. Registration shall be made by filing with the police department the name and address of the bicycle owner together with a complete description of the bicycle on forms provided by the department, and paying a fee of \$1.00. Applicants shall receive a free copy of this article. Registrations will be kept and license tags shall be valid for the life of the bike as long as it is owned by the same person. Registration shall be serially numbered and kept on file in the police department as a public record.

(b) Issuance. Upon such registration, the police department shall cause an identification tag to be affixed to the registered bicycle, serially numbered to correspond with the registration number in such a position as to be plainly visible from the rear. Such tags shall remain affixed to the bicycle unless removed by the department for cause or for retagging upon reregistration. In case of theft or loss, a duplicate tag shall be issued for a fee of \$0.50.

**Sec. 74-169. Removing tag, improper use.**

No person shall willfully remove, deface or destroy any identification tag. A tag shall not be transferred from one bicycle to another and no person shall attach to any bicycle a tag not issued for the use thereon.

**Sec. 74-170. Transfer.**

Within ten days after any bicycle registered under this article shall have changed ownership, or been dismantled or taken out of operation, the person in whose name the bicycle has been registered shall report such information to the police department. In case of change of ownership, the registration shall thereupon be changed to show the name of the new owner. In case of dismantling and taking out of operation, the registration shall be cancelled and identification tag destroyed.

**Sec. 74-171. Unsafe condition, suspension.**

No bicycle shall be registered which is in an unsafe mechanical condition. The chief of police shall have authority to suspend the registration of, and remove the identification tag from any bicycle operated contrary to any state law or city ordinance, or operated while in unsafe mechanical condition. Such suspension and removal to continue for a period not to exceed 30 days, providing that such registration shall not be reinstated or such identification tag be replaced while such bicycle is in unsafe mechanical condition. Such suspension and removal shall be in addition to another penalty provided.

**Sec. 74-172. Violations.**

Any person operating an unlicensed or unregistered bicycle, or who operates a registered bicycle in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter shall be fined as provided in section 1-14.

**Sec. 74-173. Parental responsibility.**

No parent or guardian shall authorize or knowingly permit his or her child, or ward, to violate any of the provisions of this chapter.

**Sec. 26-18. Rules and regulations.**

- (8) Bicycle riders and persons in charge of small vehicles, such as baby carriages, must confine themselves to the avenues and not ride upon or pass over lots, burial places or sections, and must observe generally the rules governing other vehicles and drivers of vehicles.
